2018 Project Grants

The Women's Fund proudly announces grants totaling \$60,000 for the following programs and agencies to improve the economic security for young women between the ages of 18 and 29 or to strengthen families using a two-generational approach.

Appleton Area School District - \$10,000

Teen Parent Support



Provides teen parents who are at-risk of dropping out of school with support and financial assistance so they will be able to remain in school, earn their high school

diploma and be on the road to self-sufficiency in adulthood.

CAP Services - \$10,000

Skills Enhancement Program



Provides job training skills for 75 women, ages 18-29, that will help them secure new higher paying employment, have access to benefits, increase their economic

security and reach their goal of becoming self-sufficient.

Fox Valley Technical College Foundation - \$10,000

Two-Generational Family Strengthening



Provides 12 women and their children with enhanced computer, digital and financial literacy skills to help strengthen their economic security.

Greater Fox Cities Habitat for Humanity - \$5,000

Women Build



Provides a single mother and her children with a home. The Women Build will engage 150 women volunteers and call attention to the lack of affordable housing and the effect it has on single parent households in the area.

Harbor House Domestic Abuse Programs - \$5,000

Economic Security for Survivors of Domestic Abuse



Provides survivors of domestic abuse access to education, training and support services they need to move toward economic

self-determination, increased wages and jobs with advancement potential.

LEAVEN - \$10,000

Young Women's Emergency Assistance Fund



Provides financial assistance, case management and

referrals to households headed by 18-29 year old women who are struggling to meet their basic needs.

Sexual Assault Crisis Center - \$10,000

Fox Cities Sexual Assault Adult Prevention Education Tipping Point



Provides training to adults on how to prevent, recognize and react responsibly

to child sexual abuse. The goal is to reach 5% of adults in the Fox Cities by 2021, the "Tipping Point" at which a new standard of child safety in our community will be created.
